Support the Next Phase of Medeiros Farm Park!



The Town of Seekonk is wrapping up the Medeiros Farm Park Master Plan and is asking for your support to move the project into its next critical phase: detailed design, permitting, and construction documents. This phase advances the consensus-based plan shaped by extensive community input—and builds on prior Town votes to preserve the property and plan its future use. It's the next step toward turning this shared vision into a built reality.

A Community Vision, Years in the Making

In 2022, Seekonk residents voted to purchase the property and to preserve the Medeiros Farm property—a 40-acre landscape rich in agricultural history and community potential. Since then, the Town has invested in developing a comprehensive master plan that reflects public input from over 640 survey responses and well-attended public meetings.

- Community gathering – event spaces, gardens, and a seasonal pavilion
- Active recreation – sports fields, pickleball, fitness trails, and playgrounds
- Passive recreation – walking loops, nature areas, and scenic open space
- Historic preservation – restoration of original farm buildings

What's on the Table Now?

Your YES vote will fund the creation of construction-ready documents that:

- Turn the master plan into detailed, buildable designs
- Allow the Town to pursue state and federal grants
- Enable bidding construction to begin

This design phase will be funded through Community Preservation Act (CPA) funds—with no impact on the tax rate. There is also potential for future construction to be funded through CPA.

Why It Matters

- Our current parks and fields are overbooked and stretched thin
- The Town lacks dedicated indoor and outdoor gathering space outside of school facilities
- This project preserves the historic farm and cultural heritage of the property
- It provides meaningful new recreation opportunities that will enhance the daily lives of Seekonk residents
- The plan reflects years of public engagement and thoughtful planning
- Without permitting and construction drawings, we can't further assess the improvements and move forward with building the park
